A few photos of the blanket chest I am working on. The old barn wood is the toughest wood I have ever worked with. It is heart pine and I was told it came from an old barn in western New York. The barn was said to be at least 150 years old. The photos show some of the "dutchman" repairs I had to make for old nail holes, gouges, and other defects in the wood. It will certainly have some character when it is completed. The first dove tail joint that I completed Sunday is shown. It was made by hand and was really tough. But the fit came out remarkably well. By the way, the end vice has been added to the end of the work bench that I purchased from Harbor Freight. It is of my own design and works great. I also added the "jack rest" (I think that is what it is called) which holds the other side of the panel as I'm working on it. It slides from side to side and the pegs can be moved from hole to hole to accommodate the height of the panel.



The bull nose plane I purchased from the club last year. I cleaned and repaired it several months ago, but I don't think I shared the photos before of the restoration. It took me about 2 hours of work to remove the nasty rust and clean it up. It now looks like new.
