Greetings Woodworkers

My scheduled class is "Turning Hollow Vessels with Lids". The instructor is Charles Farrar. I will learn not only how to hollow, but how to put collars and threaded lids on the hollow vessel.

And, yes. I will share what I learn with my fellow woodworkers. That's part of the "deal".

An update on the wood drying kiln. Once I got the inside heated, I was able to reduce the bulbs to one 40-watt bulb to maintain between 85 and 90 degrees. After installing the three additional shelves and loading them, it took a few days to get the humidity lowered once again. It is now down to about 60%. Eventually, I hope it will once again get into the lower 50% range.
