

JEFF'S LACKEY'S PROJECT

The side-doors for the chain compartments are held in place by magnets. That's an interesting story since the depth dimension was based on some published information in the Rockler catalog. When I got the initial "touch to open magnetic latches" I discovered they were too long to fit. The catalog had a typo. I called the customer service people and they were surprised. So at no cost, they supplied me with magnetic catches. Thus I had to add knobs to the side-doors. I made the knobs for the doors and the drawers with my router. Bobbi thought they were really cute. The hinges for the top are brass "stop hinges" that hold open at 95 degrees. They were expensive, around \$36 for the two hinges from Rockler.

Red duck cloth will be added as a liner to the bottom of the top compartment and drawers once the painting is completed. And I have a mirror and frame to add to the top as well. It goes in the depressed area on the top which I routed out. The 4" x 6" mirror was only \$2 at *Pain In The Glass* on SSI. The frame molding I made on my router. It will be attached so that it can be removed if the mirror ever needs to be replaced.

If you ask me for the design, you'll have to look at my sketchy notes and look inside my brain. If I make a second one, I'm not sure it would come out the same.

BTW, the "R" was added as a surprise. I printed out a font from Word that both Bobbi and I agreed was ok and then carved it out of poplar. It turned out ok. The tray on the top is for loose items at night. And the inserts in one of the drawers are two types of ring holders: posts and grooves. I'm not sure which type was desired.
