The finish was cleaned off a couple of the chairs to see what the grain painting was like underneath. It was determined to leave as much of the original painting as possible on the chairs and to just clean off the old finish on top. There is a good bit of gold pin striping on each of the chairs that is going to have to be touched up.

The next step in the process is to finish cleaning off the old finish and gluing the broken chairs back together. Remember, study up on caning methods!
